The Philippines' telecommunications industry is robust and is a key contributor to the country's economy. Continuous capital expenditure for the upgrade of communications equipment contributes to the growth of the industry and in turn ensures stateof- the-art infrastructure for businesses operating in the region. ⁴	South Africa's ICT market is the largest in Africa and continues to grow. The nation's connectivity and data infrastructure has made significant strides with SEACOM, a world-class fibre optic telecommunications network and the launch of their first commercial 5G network in 2021. The government has also introduced a Skills Development Program aiming to train 1 million young people in tech-related fields like Al and computing by 2030. ⁵
